OUR STATE of the ART Dance Studio

The Dance studio is equipped with mirrored walls for self-critique and monitoring, a hi-tech sound system and ballet, plie' bars for stretching.

Students study all genres of dance including ballet, tap, and jazz. The dance

curriculum includes study of physical fitness, health and nutrition, vocabulary, writing, math and history. Exams include the ability to perform on stage to a variety of audiences and with precision. Field trips used to enhance the dance curriculum include a visit to the theater backstage as well as watching a professional performance. Visitors are invited in to demonstrate dance career options and expectations. Our dance instructor has performed in Habana, Cuba, at Detroit Music Hall and the Detroit Opera House.







ONE-OF-A-KIND SCIENCE LABORATORY

The Science Lab has all of the necessary equipment to conduct scientific investigations and explorations through the use of technology such as microscopes, interactive software, videography, specimens and real life habitat. Students are expected dissect and analyze specimens such as plants, owl pellets, eggs, fetal pigs and insects. Live habitat include fish, hamsters, hermit crabs, and guinea pigs. The science curriculum supports the math and writing curriculum and is aligned to State benchmarks and outcomes. 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Everyday Mathematics

Everyday Mathematics is a comprehensive Pre-K through 6th grade mathematics curriculum developed by the University of Chicago School Mathematics Project and published by McGraw-Hill Education. It is research-based and proven to strengthen students critical thinking and problemsolving strategies. Students explore math through fun games and model building activities. Everyday Math also includes Deluxe eSuite, an electronic edition where students can access the textbook, workbooks, homework (study links/home links),





games and assessments. The 7th and 8th grade students use the University of Chicago School Math Project curriculum, following the same pedagogy/philosophy using Pre-Algebra and Algebra. It's a flexible program, allowing schools to offer the appropriate mathematics to students regardless of their grade level. Students will be prepared for high school and all future courses. Reading and journal writing are incorporated into the math program to support communication skills.



Special Education

The Special Education program uses an inclusive model and the resource room supports students to meet their educational goals.

Our special education staff meet the highly qualified requirements continue to update their "The only way we can be there for our children is to be there for ourselves." knowledge on the latest regulations and compliance requirements. The goal is to ensure that all students receive a quality education and demonstrate growth. All students participate in standardized testing, including MEAP Access, MI Access and Scantron.

Success for All Reading Program

Commonwealth Academy has been a partner with the Success for All Foundation since 2000. SFA is based in Baltimore, Maryland and continuously conducts research to update curriculum. This reform model focuses on building the achievement and success of our children through the use of cooperative-learning strategies and engaging novels.

Students are assessed every eight weeks and placed in developmentally appropriate reading groups. During this time, teachers and students engage in active instruction where new skills, concepts and strategies are modeled to the students through guided practice. Additionally, students use Partner/Team Practice to reinforce skills, develop reading fluency and enrich







vocabulary. Scholastic Reading Inventory (SRI) is the district internal assessment used to determine student progress after each 8 week cycle. Furthermore, students are encouraged to celebrate their achievements of mastery through sharing and recognition of their accomplishments during the quarterly reading celebrations.
